RESOLUTION 2014-02
Setting Tax Rate and DOR Collection


Whereas, the Okanogan County Transit Authority (hereafter Authority) placed a ballot proposition to authorize sales tax collection of up to 4/10th of one percent on the General Election ballot of November 5, 2013 for the purpose of operating, maintaining and providing equipment and facilities for a public transportation system; and

Whereas, the proposition was approved by the voters; and

Whereas, the Authority is required to provide the Department of Revenue with a fixed rate to collect.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Okanogan County Transit Authority Board of Directors that the sales tax rate to be collected within the Okanogan Public Transportation Benefit Area is fixed at four tenths of one percent (0.4%), and directs the Department of Revenue to collect those funds.
